- The Position:** Subject to approval by the Provost's Office, the Department of Economics anticipates one tenure-track opening for a new faculty member. Although the position is open to any field, preference will be given to candidates with research interests in experimental economics, applied econometrics, or any subfield of microeconomics related to public policy.
- In addition, 20-40% of the workload will entail managing the Center for Economic Education. The Center for Economic Education's primary focus is teacher training and the Center engages in many activities to support the teaching of economics such as offering in-service courses, providing consultant services to schools, educational agencies, and community groups and developing curriculum materials. Center Director's duties include teaching specialized credit economics courses and related non-credit programs for K-12 teachers; administering grants and contracts to support center operations; administrative duties related to day-to-day operations of the center; curriculum-development work with school districts; development of high-quality economic education instructional materials/curriculum; maintenance of state, national, and international contacts in economic education; board service on the Alaska Council on Economic Education, a non-profit educational organization; and developing and maintaining community partnerships.
- Qualifications:** Ph.D. in economics or resource economics, as well as a strong commitment to quality research and teaching. ABD with expected completion by August 2009 will be considered.
- Salary:** Competitive and based on qualifications.
- Setting:** The Department of Economics has 11 faculty members and about 100 undergraduate majors. The department is developing a strong program in experimental economics with an emphasis on public policy applications. We emphasize close faculty-student interaction and strongly encourage undergraduate research. Anchorage, a diverse city of nearly 300,000, is located at the base of the Chugach Mountains and offers outstanding outdoor recreation opportunities. The city also offers excellent social and cultural amenities.
