** **PREREQUISITES:**

MATH 200 – Either MATH 107 and MATH 108 or MATH 109 with a grade of "C" or higher, or Math Placement Test.

MATH 272 – MATH 270 or MATH 107

BA 273 – CIS 110 and [MATH 107 or MATH 270]

Math skills are important in the study of economics. For this reason majors are to complete their math requirements early in their program. Students planning on graduate school are advised to take the entire calculus sequence (MATH 200, 201 and 202).

*** No more than a total of 6 credits earned in an independent study, or ECON 454, Economics Internship, may be used to satisfy requirements for the major (6 hours of independent study or 3 credits of independent study and 3 credits of ECON 454).

† Admission to Upper-Division Standing does not waive individual course prerequisites (e.g., course prerequisites for BA 377 are: BA 273 and MATH 272).

Note: A total of 120 credits is required for the BA degree, of which 48 credits must be upper-division. Students must complete at least 12 credits of their Economics courses in residence at UAA.
